Students Strike For Climate Rights

Bloomfield students joined 6,000 protestors in Belfast on Friday to voice their concerns about the rapid change in our climate.

On Friday 20th September, 13 students joined the massive movement that was started a year ago by Swedish teen Greta Thunberg. Starting with a group rally at Cornmarket, the Bloomfield students soon managed to lead the march through City Centre. The day was concluded by speeches at City Hall, by both students and politicians. Standing right at the barrier like 12 year olds at a One Direction concert, the girls led a series of chants and managed to make it onto multiple news outlets. The protest started in Cornmarket, where the girls stood up to Communism (literally) as they blocked their flags with home-

Recipe of the Month

Salted Caramel popcorn pretzel brownies

Ingredients:

- ~150g light brown sugar
- ~225g caster sugar
- ~200g butter
- ~150g dark chocolate
- ~3 eggs
- ~125g plain flour
- ~30g cocoa powder
- ~50g sweet and salty popcorn
- ~25g salted pretzels

Method:

1. Preheat oven to 180°C/160°C fan / and line a brownie tin with some baking paper.
2. Place the sugars and the butter into a large saucepan and heat on medium (check up occasionally and stir) until the butter and sugar have become one. It should not be grainy and they should be one liquid instead of two (you'll get what that means when you do it!).
3. Add the dark chocolate (chopped) into the warm sugar and butter mixture and stir until its melted. Allow to cool until it's a nice warm instead of boiling hot.
4. When the brownie mixture is cool enough to comfortably touch, mix in the eggs. Add flour and cocoa powder before stirring to combine. You don't want to mix the substance too much or your brownies will be a disaster. Spread it into tin.
5. Put as many pretzels and popcorn as you like on the mixture and bake (for 25-30 mins) until it looks like A* level brownies.
6. Add caramel sauce (look up how to make it).
7. Enjoy.
